

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There has been a lot of BOT activity over the holiday period, resulting in a few changes. As Hayley is now a member of our staff, she has resigned from the Board of Trustees. The team has voted, and we are pleased to welcome Jamie Andrews to the position of Presiding Member (Chairperson). With Jamie at the helm, we are in great hands!

Our staff have also nominated and voted Hayley into the position of Staff Representative, so we're excited to continue having Hayley on the Board as we tackle our most pressing task: recruiting a new Principal.

Thank you to the parents and families who joined us for the parent meeting with Richard Clarke on Tuesday, 4th February, and to those who contributed via email. Your input is incredibly valuable. We also hope that the opportunity to meet Richard, gain insight into the process, and ask questions was helpful for you.

For those who weren't able to make it to our whānau meeting with Richard Clarke, we are pleased to be able to let you know the timeline for our Principal recruitment. Here are the highlights -

- We are currently developing the role description, completing community consultation and creating an application pack. The job advert will go live on the 3rd of March.
- The community will be informed of the appointment around the 15th of May.
- The intention is for the new Principal to start on day 1 of Term 3.

Looking ahead, we have BOT elections coming up in September. Serving on the Board is a valuable way for you to make a meaningful contribution to our school and help shape its future direction. The BOT oversees the governance of the school, including finances, personnel, health & safety, property, and policies. We rely on parent volunteers who attend monthly meetings and support the Principal with matters outside of the meetings. If you're wondering whether a role on the Board could be for you, we have a series of upcoming training sessions with Richard Clarke for current BOT members and any prospective board members. Our first session will be on the 6th of March. We encourage all parents to attend these sessions to learn more about the roles and responsibilities of the Board, which will help inform your decision about standing for election.
