Registration & Locating a pet

Registration forms will be sent home or uploaded as a google form on Hero in due course. If your unable to locate a pet we are able to source Saanen baby goats, but only while they last. The goats are free and you can either choose to keep them or send them back after pet day. If multiple families would like a goat we can get him to meet us half way for pick up. - Contact Gabbie to arrange.

Types of pets

Types of pets allowed at pet day are Calves, Lambs, Goats, Dogs and indoor pets. All pets must be well cared for, well secured and upto date with their worming. Each child can enter multiple pet categories i.e a lamb, a calf and a dog. However they cannot enter two of the same pet category i.e two calves.

Judging Criteria for Pet Day:

- **Indoor Art:** will be judged the evening before Pet Day by selected local community members who generously volunteer their time to support our school. All entries will be anonymous to ensure fair and unbiased judging.
- Indoor Pets: Students must write a letter about their pet and display it on the pet's cage. Judging will be based on the creativity of the letter, the presentation of the cage, and the overall health and care of the pet.
- Lambs, Goats, and Calves: Please keep an eye on Hero–links to the Judges' Handbooks and Pet Day Registration Forms will be uploaded soon.
- **Dogs:** Once our dog judge is confirmed, we will upload the judging criteria to Hero as well.

You will need to know whether your animal falls into the Early or Late class based on their date of birth:

- Lambs & Goats:
 - Early: Born 1st July 2025 19th August 2025
 - Late: Born 20th August 2025 20th September 2025
- Calves:
 - Early: Born 1st June 2025 26th July 2025
 - Late: Born 27th July 2025 20th September 2025

Board Of Trustees Update

Upcoming School Board Elections

Kia ora whānau,

Our upcoming School Board Elections will be held on **Thursday 11th September**. This is a wonderful opportunity for parents and caregivers to actively contribute to the future direction of our kura. We encourage those interested in standing for election to consider the valuable role they can play in supporting our learners and upholding the values of our school community.

Nominations are open now, so start thinking now about how you might get involved or who you would like to nominate.

The Board would like to acknowledge the continued improvement in attendance across our school community. The **government's goal** is for 80% of students to attend school at least 90% of the time — that's fewer than five days off per term. It's an ambitious target, but part of our role as a Board is to support the Principal and staff to do our best to meet it.

In Term 4 last year, only 23% of our students met the 90% attendance target. In Term 1 this year, that figure rose to 56%, and in Term 2, 54% of students met the goal. This is great progress, and we're encouraged by the upward trend – but we still have a way to go to reach the 80% target set by the government.

While it is important to keep children at home when they are unwell, we ask that families carefully consider the timing of family holidays and avoid extra days off where possible. Attendance is recorded in half days, so even part-day absences can add up. If your child has a weekday appointment, consider sending them to school for part of the day, rather than keeping them home for the full day. Every day at school is a valuable learning opportunity, and regular absences do impact a child's learning and progress.

If your child's attendance fell below 90% last term, you may receive a letter from the school on our behalf. This is not intended as a reprimand, but rather a gentle reminder of the commitment we all share to meet the government's expectations for school attendance. We understand there are often genuine reasons for absence, and we appreciate your efforts to support your child's learning by ensuring they are at school as often as possible.
