School Uniform at Te Akau School

At Te Akau School, wearing the correct uniform shows pride in our kura and helps create a strong sense of belonging for everyone.

Our uniform includes a Te Akau polo shirt, sweater or hoodie, and plain black shorts, skorts, tights, pants, or trackpants. Leaders' shirts may be worn on special occasions. Black thermal tops are permitted under school shirts in winter and raincoats or winter coats may be worn to and from school only, not in the classroom.

Small plain stud earrings or small, plain sleepers with a release catch are allowed. If your child wears a necklace with cultural significance, please contact their classroom teacher to gain permission for it to be worn at school. Students wearing incorrect uniform items will be asked to remove them, and parents will be contacted. Fake nails are not permitted at school. Measles Update from the Public Health Nurse

Airiini, our Public Health Nurse, visited Te Akau School today to provide an update on the recent measles outbreak in New Zealand. At this stage, there are no recorded cases in the Waikato.

The first symptoms of measles are often similar to a cold, COVID-19, or the flu, which can make it difficult to recognize at first. Symptoms include:

- Fever (temperature of at least 38°C)
- Cough
- Runny nose
- · Sore, red eyes
- Rash

The rash usually appears 3 to 5 days after the first symptoms. It starts as pink or red spots or bumps on the face before spreading down the rest of the body. The rash is not usually itchy and can last for a week or more.

If you or your child develop any of these symptoms, please stay home and seek urgent medical advice by calling your doctor or Healthline on 0800 611 116.

Checking Immunisation Status

Adults should check their measles immunisation records through one of the following:

- My Health Record, Your GP or doctor, Your Childhood My Health Book, Laboratory results or Any overseas immunisation records **Immunity guidelines:**
- People born in New Zealand before 1 January 1969 are considered immune.
- People born after 1 January 1969 need to have received two doses of the MMR (measles) vaccine after 12 months of age to be fully protected.
- People born between 1969 and 2004 should note they may not have received two doses, as the vaccination schedule changed over time.
- People born overseas may not have complete records or may have received the measles vaccine before 12 months of age, meaning they may not be fully protected.
